#### FROM THE CCCB

CCCB BRIEF ON BILL C-14 ("medical assistance in dying") TO STANDING COMMITTEE ON JUSTICE AND HUMAN RIGHTS: As clearly stated in its <u>previous statements</u> on this issue, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops absolutely and categorically disagrees with any attempt at justifying or supporting a "right" to assisted suicide or euthanasia. This is based on the unchanging teaching of our Church, derived from the teaching of Christ himself, that these practices are always inherently wrong (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church 2276-79; St. John Paul II, Evangelium Vitae n. 66). For this reason, Bill C-14, which legalizes the killing of certain categories of persons, is a fundamentally unjust law. From the Catholic perspective, no amendments could legitimate the inherent evil in the premises behind the proposed legislation. More...
